Revenue Contract Renewal: Wayne State University, funded by Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS)

In this contract renewal, CMHA-CEI will to provide TFCO services to Wayne State University for the period of October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021 and receive \$394,578 for those services provided.

<u>Revenue Contract Renewal: Children's Trauma Initiative – Michigan Department of</u> <u>Health and Human Services (MDHHS)</u>

Additional Contribution to MERS for FY 2020

Stacia said she is recommending an additional contribution of \$10M to MERS. She noted that CEI is showing a lapse in Medicaid sources of \$13M through June 30, 2020. Stacia doesn't believe we will ever be able to match this contribution again in the future, and believes we should take advantage of the situation. She noted we are lapsing funds with underspending due to COVID, as well as the closing of the Transitions programs.

Sara said Medicaid enrollments have increased under COVID, which we never could have projected with budgeting. Raul was in total agreement with the \$10M contribution, as was Kay. Kay wondered where this would leave CEI in our standings with unfunded liability? Stacia said this would take a good dent out of the \$70M unfunded liability, and although it leaves us short, it moves us in the right direction.

Joe said he is surprised at the large amount recommended, but he is supportive of the amount. Stacia put it into perspective that although \$10M in a large amount, it is less than 7% of CEI's total budget.

FY 19/20 4th Quarter Amended Budget

Stacia presented the 4th quarter amended budget to the committee.

MOVED by Dianne Holman and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties Board of Directors approve the FY 19/20 4th Quarter Amended Budget.

<u>Steady State Program Proposals to Balance FY 2021 Budget</u> Stacia said that before we received numbers from MSHN, the variance was \$3.4M. The \$2.4M in above the line requests included increased wages for staffing and contractors, as well as \$215k for laptops, and \$1.1M for an additional MERS contribution in FY21. This leaves \$978k to be distributed among programs.

Stacia reviewed the program proposals to balance the steady state budget. This includes the three above the line requests noted above. Stacia noted the MERS contribution of \$1.1M is an attempt to move our unfunded liability number heading in the correct direction, though this is just a drop in the bucket.

Shana reviewed the program proposals for AMHS. This includes adding a full time ACT Secretary, a full time RN to split time between Eaton County and Clinton County Counseling Centers, and an increase in a residential contract budget line where there have been gaps. Kay asked what the hiring experience has been in regards to RNs? Shana said the HR department does a nice job of recruiting. We have been able to fill nursing positions with qualified talent recently.

Karla reviewed CSDD's proposals, which included adding an after-hours coordinator, three support therapists, and a coordinator to support the autism center. With the grow of autism supports, Karla feels a proper coordinator is needed for the program. Kay wondered how the shift from the Transitions day programs interfaces with what Karla is presenting here? Karla said they don't necessarily crossover; autism is in its own category, and is tied to local demand for services. In relation to the other positions mentioned, those are in long-standing programs and don't directly correlate with the Transitions programs, either. Sara went on to say that COVID has derailed plans that were made to continue growing the skill-building programs, which has also contributed to the lapse in Medicaid dollars.

Gwenda said Families Forward is going to bring back supports to early intervention services, in particular, the daycare expulsion program. Previously, this was funded by prevention dollars, and now there is a Medicaid billable code for these services.

Sara shared that there is a position in QCSRR (prevention, public relations, outreach) that General Admin and QCSRR will be adding money to, to upgrade to a specialist position. Sara also noted that \$14k will be added to the emergency notification system gap, as well as \$7.4k put towards relief security coverage.

Stacia said that Utilization Management will be adding additional Utilization Management to add relief to hospital stay reviews, as hospital stays have increased greatly as of late.

Sharon said she doesn't have any HR budget changes for this fiscal year. Instead, money will be put into the Relias online training services in the training unit budget. A small amount will be put towards the Legal line for Deferred Compensation committee, as well.

Stacia shared that she will be increasing contract consultation funds, and well as outreach and outreach supply lines.

Stacia said IS will be increasing the budget for consumable supplies as well as increasing the budget for furniture and equipment in the move toward a more permanent remote work force.
