New Expense Contracts

MOVED by Kay Randolph-Back and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into the following new expense contracts based on the fact that the information has been reviewed and the proposals are in line with agency responsibilities:

New Expense Contract: Grand Traverse Resort and Spa, LLC

Tim Hanna asked how many people attend this conference? Gwenda said we are the state-wide coordinator for the Trauma Initiative as well as DBT, and several hundred

people attend this conference. CEI will pay Grand Traverse Resort and Spa, LLC and \$88,900 for the period of April 28, 2024 through May 2, 2024.

<u>New Expense Contract: Kellogg Hotel & Conference Center</u> CEI will pay the Kellogg Center for conference services \$92,000 for the period September 17, 2023 through September 21, 2023.

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Expense Contract Amendments

MOVED by Kay Randolph-Back and SUPPORTED by Tim Hanna that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into the following expense contract amendments based on the fact that the information has been reviewed and the proposals are in line with agency responsibilities:

Expense Contract Amendment: Jennifer Wilgocki

Under this contract amendment, CMHA-CEI will work with Jennifer Wilgocki to provide Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy to CMHSPs and pay \$60,200 for those services for the period October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Expense Contract Amendment: Kelly Wilson

Under this contract amendment, CMHA-CEI will work with Kelly Wilson to provide Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy to CMHSP's and pay \$47,300 for those services for the retroactive period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Revenue Contract Renewal: Mid-State Health Network Spenddown Payment for Clubhouse Activities

Sue Panetta presented this item. Spenddowns were put on hold during the pandemic; MSHN renewed for the same amount as previous spenddown contracts held with CEI. Kay asked about folks who are not Clubhouse members but are participating in services in other ways and have spenddown; she wondered what the revenue sources were for those people? Sara said Ingham County Health Millage has been a source for many, many spenddowns in the past, as well as general fund and local dollars.

ACTION:

MOVED by Kay Randolph-Back and SUPPORTED by Tim Hanna that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to renew the contract with Mid-State Health Network (MSHN), which establishes payment by MSHN which will be applied to CMHA-CEI consumers' spenddown obligations related to clubhouse activities/participation, not to exceed the amount of \$60,000.00, for the retroactive period of October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Medicaid Revenue Update

Sue Panetta presented the Medicaid Revenue report through March. We will begin to see some of these numbers change as we go through redeterminations. For June, we have approximately 760 folks who will be going through redetermination, but this won't result in a huge impact in the revenue dollars just yet. At this point, we are trending out at \$11M ahead from what was projected in the budget.

Joe noted that he saw a report that the largest reduction would be in HealthyMI.

Sue said we do have the ability to track folks who are in services with CEI who lose Medicaid, so she will be bringing this report to the Board.

<u>Unfinished Business:</u> None

New Business

a. Board Per Diem Recommendation

Sara pulled the data together to provide to the Board regarding per diems across the state. Sue said the resulting recommendation is to raise the per diem from \$40 to \$65.

Kay said she felt the data was pulled together really well and is clear.

Sara clarified the increase would be available to all members across all Board committees, including consumers.

Joe said it is up to the committee whether they would like to move this item to the larger Board.

Raul said he feels that \$80 is a fair per diem. Sara said the mental health code states that, "A board member shall be paid a per diem no larger than the highest per diem for members of other county advisory boards set by the county board of commissioners

and be reimbursed for necessary travel expenses for each meeting attended". Raul said in this case, since the highest number is \$75 in Gratiot County, the per diem should be \$75. He went on to say this money is also taxed.

ACTION:

MOVED by Time Hanna and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize to increase the Board per diem rate from \$40 to \$75.

Motion carried UNANIMOUSLY.

Public Comment:

Raul wanted to thank the Board members present for consideration for the \$75 per diem recommendation.

Adjournment:
