Previous Meeting Minutes

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Public Comment:

Stacey Lehmann shared that her husband, David Lehmann had severe mental illness and took his own life on or before August 25, 2024. Dave had been actively seeking help for years and focused many hours, days, and years trying to improve his mental outlook. He left behind a series of journals chronicling his mental health journey. He read many books, listened to many hours of podcasts, and watched many videos on the subject. He spoke with his therapist, nurse practitioner, doctor, wife, and father about his struggles, but stigma is very real and he was limited in what he shared with others. He was extremely intelligent and creative having obtained a Bachelor's degree in Kinesiology from the University of Michigan and Masters in Teaching from The College of St Scholastica in Duluth, Minnesota. He built furniture that will last decades, created wind chimes with such math and precision that they will forever sing beautifully, cooked delicious meals that leave my mouth watering still today, and made people laugh until tears came out of their eyes.

Describing Mr. Lehmann as a 36-year old dog dad, husband, son, best friend, educator, runner, chef, comedian, Yooper living with the trolls who brought joy and light to those around him.

Ms. Lehmann expressed that initially she wanted to present to the CMHA-CEI Board of Directors after not liking the initial response received from CEI after reporting his suicide, requesting records, and filing a recipient rights complaint. However, since that time, she has spoken with Aleshia Echols, Sara Lurie, Kristy Medes, and Greg Fox who were all extremely kind and compassionate and assisted with the receipt of his clinical record.

I am proud that CEI is making changes to better support widows and those who have lost individuals to suicide in their time of crisis immediately following the act, and I am also happy to learn that CEI is implementing Zero Suicide throughout the agency to give everyone the training necessary to be compassionate and empathetic to those individuals in their worst moments and to work to prevent suicide, because I do believe that Dave's death could have been prevented. I hope by speaking about it, I

can help save a life.

I will continue to be a voice for services for those with mental illness and criminal behavior, to hopefully help find ways to improve referrals, access, and coordination of care.

Dave was not his worst days or worst acts. Neither am I. Neither are you! Dave was resilient and had an amazing heart. He was funny and intelligent. He was complex. We used to always say to each other that it is hard being a human. That is the truth!

Mrs. Lehmann thanked the board members for their time and continued advocacy for those who have mental health and behavioral challenges and struggles.

Mid-State Health Network (MSHN) Update:

Board member, Paul Palmer reported that there was a public hearing at the beginning of the month. During the meeting the proposed budget was reviewed. Issues related to the budget were discussed including the losses in Medicaid in spite of the expanded need for services. Additionally, MSHN reported tapping into internal service funds; with concerns of possibly depleting state funds unless a rate adjustment is made.

Mr. Palmer advised that he will be watching to see if the state system provides the rates needed, reporting that ultimately the board approved the budget.

CEO REPORT

As part of the CEO Report, Sara Lurie introduced Dr. Jennifer Stanley, MD who presented on Psychiatric Medications. Highlights from the presentation included:

- Role of Medication
- Classes of Medications
- Antipsychotics
- Mood Stabilizers
- Antidepressants
- Anxiolytics
- Sleep Medications
- Medications for side effects

In response to questions from board members, Dr. Stanley shared the following information:

• CMHA-CEI has 19 prescribers (11 direct employed and 8 contractors)

- Choice of medications housed at the in-house pharmacy are selected are based on the most commonly used drugs. Physician drug choices for consumers are typically based on side effects, symptoms, and in some cases, patient preference.
- Pharmaceutical representatives have been banned from hosting lunches to CEI staff to present their preferred meds. However, we do allow them to drop off literature at the front reception desk.
- CMHA-CEI does not require consumers to utilize a specific pharmacy, it is the consumer preference. However, the CMHA-CEI ACT program strongly prefers to use the in-house pharmacy.
- Ascension Pharmacy is the in-house pharmacy, and currently stocks the most commonly prescribed medications. However, they also have the ability to order from the warehouse, as needed.
- Prescription reminders are sent from the pharmacy. Refills are reviewed during medical appointments. All controlled substances may be reviewed in the Michigan Automated Prescription System (MAPS).

In closing, Dr. Stanley expressed that medications are only a part of treatment, not the whole treatment for everyone, noting that symptoms may persist even with best available treatment.

Board members, Timothy Hanna, Raul Gonzales and Dwight Washington thanked Dr. Stanley for the extremely informative presentation.

Other CEO Updates included:

<u>Upcoming retirement of Karla Block, Director of Community Services for the Developmentally Disabled (CSDD)</u>

In the absence of Karla Block, this evening, CEO Lurie announced the upcoming retirement open house scheduled on Friday, October 11, in the Atrium from 2 – 4pm in Karla's honor, extending an invitation to board members to attend. Board Chair, Maxine Thome, on behalf of the CMHA-CEI Board of Directors expressed sincere appreciation and gratitude for her unwavering creativity, dedication, leadership, and strength during her 31+ years of dedicated service to CMHA-CEI during very challenging times. Board members were in support that Karla leaves a very positive legacy, and that she will be sorely missed! However, joined Sara in congratulating Karla on her well-deserved retirement and in offering best wishes in this next chapter of life!

Loss of contracts with community partners

CEO, Lurie reported that there has been a loss of contracts with community partners due to tough financial state, which have lead them to make cuts in contracts before making cuts to their own staffing which include the following:

- ICHD Staff Reduction, reporting that CMHA-CEI will continue to serve as best we can although we will no longer be embedded within the hospital and work with ICHD in the hope that over time, there will be an expansion in services.
- McLaren Greater Lansing and CMHA-CEI (Crisis Mental Health Therapist) ED Staffing Agreement termination notice effective 9/30/24, not extending the Independent Contractor Agreement for provision of clinical services. An Agreement that dated back to 2017.

Board Member Al Platt, inquired as to whether the loss of contracts will affect the Crisis Stabilization Center. CEO, Lurie advised "no" as the old building has been sold and is no longer under McLaren. Additionally, building is becoming productive and will include sub contracts with labs, pharmacy services.

ACTION: RFP will be considered.

Management/Negotiation Team

Kudos to the negotiation management team led by Jana Baylis, Chief Human Resource Officer. Other members of the team included: Gwenda Summers, FF Director; Joanne Holland, Chief Information Officer, and Sue Panetta, Chief Financial Officer) for their work with the union partners to quickly reach Tentative Contract Agreements, which will be reviewed for approval at this evening's board meeting.

National Health Services New Site Application

CEO, Lurie stated that she cannot express how huge this is for the license staff, as it makes them eligible to qualify for student loan assistance. Special thank you to: Pam Flory who was relentless getting us across the finish line. Other members of the team included: Jana Baylis, Morgan Mckittrick, Janiel Pelton, and Sue Panetta.

CCBHC Full Certification

Kudos to the CCBHC Team led by Stacy Fox-Elster. Other members include: Marti Rucker-Callow and all of the Directors and staff who were involved in pulling together and submitting required documentation for a positive result which include no plan of correction. Awesome job!

Consumer Advisory Council (CAC) Representative Report

CEO, Lurie announced that effective October 17, there will be a CAC Representative present to provide a report to the CMHA-CEI Board of Directors.
