CEO REPORT

CEO, Sara Lurie provided verbal updates on the following items from her written report:

CMHA-CEI Community Needs Assessment

The CEI Community Needs Assessment was provided to the Access Committee for input. The QCSRR team is will be looking to refine the data sets and incorporate new CCBHC required needs assessment data into it during FY24.

Legislature Updates

Sara connected with Alan Bolter and Bob Sheehan about the potential of them coming to the Board in 2024 and provided an update on happenings in the legislature and upcoming election topics.

Annual Community Event Speaker

Sara reported that we have secured our keynote for the Annual Breakfast, Dr. Tonya C. Bailey. From her bio; "Dr. Bailey is an accomplished executive leader with over 25 years of experience in higher education and corporate settings, leading transformative programming, and implementing award-winning diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) initiatives, coaching, and teaching services".

Waskul Settlement

This lawsuit originated in Washtenaw County in relation to self-determination. She wanted this on Board members' radars.

Crisis Stabilization Unit

We are waiting to flesh out some language in several agreements to move forward with next steps on the CSU. Sara is hoping to be able to take Board members over to the new facility early next year to take a tour.

Sara is hoping the staff and Board members are able to get a break over the holidays and looks forward to more good work being done in the new year.

Dwight echoed Sara's sentiments and hopes everyone has a safe holiday season.

CASE MANAGEMENT CSDD PRESENTATION

CEO, Sara Lurie introduced Karla Block, Director of Community Services for the Developmentally Disabled. Karla then described the role of the Case Management unit within CSDD. She introduced Marie Carrel, Life Consultation Supervisor and Amy Wortley, Family Support Supervisor.

Marie and Amy walked the group through the Case Management unit at CEI. The unit is now split between two departments, children and adults. Case Management is defined by the Medicaid Provider Manual. Case Management links, coordinates, and monitors several aspects of an individual's life. Marie provided a visual representation of an individual's life and described it as the spokes on a bike tire. In the modern day, folks have a lot more choices to navigate including housing, career, social relationships, etc., and the CM team helps connect folks to resources to support their needs and wants.

Amy Wortley described a Case Management intake. In order to be eligible for CEI services, a person has to be limited in at least three or more areas of major life activity as defined by the Michigan Mental Health Code, such as self-care, learning, mobility, and economic self-sufficiency.

Marie then reviewed the historic model of institutional care for those with intellectual or development disabilities. She noted we have come a long way since the days of institutions and have made long strides in support of individuals in the community and in their homes.

Marie read the mission of CSDD and Case Management, which is "To promote and support ongoing choices and opportunities for people and their families to be full and equal citizens in the community."

Amy then spoke about the Family Support portion of Case Management. She noted that 95% of Access calls to CEI are for Family Support for Autism Services. Currently, Family Support serves approx. 500 children and their families.

Then, Amy reviewed the functions of the Life Consultation unit. We currently serve approximately 1,000 adults. Targeted Case Management visits occur largely in the community. Life Consultation incorporates principles of person centered planning, self-determination, and social justice with those we support.
