## **ABOUT THE COURSE**

Mental Health First Aid is the initial help given to a person showing symptoms of mental illness or in a mental health crisis.

Mental Health First Aid may be utilized until appropriate professional or other help, including peer and family support, can be engaged.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is primarily designed for adults who, regularly interact with young people (ages 12-18). Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches adults to help adolescents who are experiencing a mental health or addictions challenge or is in crisis.

Both these 8-hour courses prepare members of the public to provide Mental Health First Aid to those in need. This course is delivered by certified Mental Health First Aid USA instructors who completed a 5-day training and meet other certifications.

## **CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS**

CMHA-CEI is offering up to 7.5 Continuing Education Credits for Nurses, Social Workers, and Substance Abuse Professionals. Teachers may qualify for 7.0 SCECH for a very small fee. Please inquire if you would like more information about earning the SCECH credits.

#### **Timeframe and Location:**

Full day training from 8:30am to 5:00pm (must attend full 8 hours to get certificate) held at CMHA-CEI's Atrium, 812 E. Jolly Road Lansing, MI 48910.

NOTE: Due to the popularity of MHFA, payment must be received by CMHA-CEI prior to the date of training.
