Dr. Jennifer Stanley said we lost a lot of psych time in the last two to three months, and intakes are currently scheduling out to November. Dr. Jose Herrera has offered his private practice for some emergent psych services for folks coming out of the hospital. The advantage of this contract is the short-term work that will be completed, which is generally not what new employees are looking for.

a. CSU Update

Sara had a very productive CSU meeting last week in terms of moving the bond forward. Some key questions were answered in this meeting. Ingham County is indicating they are willing to go forward with the resolution that would allow the public notice to go out. The resolution will go through Health and Human Services and County Services or Finance Committee, and then it will go to the Public Commission. The public notice would go out at this time. In the meantime, we will be using some grant dollars to start pre-construction to keep things moving. We will be using the \$3.3M from the SAMHSA staffing grant to begin hiring, training, etc. as these funds are not available for much longer. The total building project is about \$31M, with \$10.8M in grants.

Tim asked how many FTE's we are hiring? Dr. Stanley these numbers haven't been solidified yet. Sara would like to start hiring in the Spring. We already have a Nursing Administrator hired.

Al wondered if we have a ballpark date for when we can start accepting clients at the CSU? Sara said this all depends on when we can start construction.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this new contract, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) will purchase Community Living Supports (CLS), Respite Services, and other services as indicated, for the period of September 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025 from Alternative Choices, LLC.

The revenue and expense of this contract is reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY 2024/2025 budget. The revenue sources that support this contract are from Medicaid and the State Plan. The CLS expenses of this contract are reflected in the Contract Client line item of the Life Consultation Alternative Supports, Children's Waiver, and Children's Alternative Services budget. The Respite Services are reflected in the Contract Client line item of the Respite budget. This contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

DESCRIPTION OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Community Living Supports are provided by aides in the home or community setting to increase or maintain personal self-sufficiency, increase skills, build social skills and relationships, as well as participate in the community. Respite services help the consumer's primary caregivers by providing them with short-term, intermittent support and relief to assist in maintaining the goal for the individual to live in their family home. Respite care through these contracts can be provided in the consumer's home, the home of a friend or relative, or in the community. Family Training and Non-Family Training provide family focused services to family or support staff for the purpose of assisting the family in relating to, caring for, and/or living with an individual receiving services. Families and consumers

may choose their provider from those agencies meeting the qualifications of CMHA-CEI's provider panel.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this new contract, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) will purchase specialized residential services from the adult foster care provider listed below for the period of August 22, 2024 through September 30, 2025. The effective date of this contract is contingent upon LARA AFC licensure and HCBS approval.

The expense of this contract is reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY 2024-25 budget. The revenue sources that support the contract are Medicaid, Healthy Michigan Plan (HMP), Habilitative Supports Waiver (HSW), Medicaid Spend-down/Deductible, State General fund dollars and other Community Mental Health Services Programs (CMHSP) through County of Financial Responsibility (COFR) agreements, and Local funding. The expense of the contract is reflected in the various contract residential line items of the AMHS and CSDD residential budgets. The contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

SUMMARY OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN THE CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Services provided under this contract include a range of residential care to MI and DD adults defined by one of three levels of service intensity. Overall, the provider is

reimbursed at the same rate for each level of care. Occasionally, rates are supplemented to reflect additional costs such as day treatment transportation or an exceptional level of care based on consumer needs.
