Sara Lurie said we presented this for the Community Project grant and were awarded dollars. We are going to expend as many Stabenow Community Project dollars as possible this year; the dollars from the Peters Community Project will likely be carried into next year.

#### **Unfinished Business**

#### a. CSU Update

John Peiffer presented an update on the Crisis Stabilization Unit. All due diligence on the bond has been completed. The bond is currently sitting in the 45-day referendum period. As of 10/23, we will be able to move forward. We are probably looking at a 20-year payback on this bond.

Facilities planning as far as colors and finishes are wrapping up. The selections need to be taken to Director's Group and the Consumer Advisory Committee.

Critical items that are currently being worked on include the development of the purchase agreement and condo agreement. Sub-contractor bid selections are in process with Grainger Construction, and the pre-construction and demolition package is under review pending approval by CEI. John is hoping some demolition can begin in early November. Construction will likely begin at the end of December. Right now, the projected completion date with Grainger is 2/3/2026, which John is hoping to move up. He will work with Grainger to tighten this schedule.

John then shared the preliminary project schedule for the construction of the CSU. He shared that construction of each floor will take approximately 200 days.

Shana shared what she learned at Network 180 regarding recruiting staff for the CSU. She is hopeful folks will be hired by 10/1/2025. Shana said the training program will consist of a lot of hands-on training. Sara said we are planning to do a groundbreaking, potentially on 11/25, with Senator Stabenow in attendance. Branding needs to be completed by this time. The title does have to have the word "crisis" in it. The PR subcommittee has a meeting this weekend, and Piper and Gold is going to review timelines around the groundbreaking.

#### b. <u>CAC Representative Selection Update</u>

Sara Lurie was happy to report that all of the work that has been done to prepare CAC to represent themselves at the Board of Directors meetings has been completed. The CAC only had one applicant, Daniel Arnold, and he was unanimously voted in as the representative. Daniel will serve a one-year term. The CAC is going to delay the election of an alternate a bit so more folks can meet the six-month membership requirement, and maybe others will show interest in being the alternate. The first Board meeting (October) will mostly just be an introduction. In subsequent months, the CAC will bring a report to the Board. Sara said the CAC was fully engaged in this process and had to make a lot of important decisions for it along the way.

Community Living Supports are provided by aides in the home or community setting to increase or maintain personal self-sufficiency, increase skills, build social skills and relationships, as well as participate in the community. Respite services help the consumer's primary caregivers by providing them with short-term, intermittent support and relief to assist in maintaining the goal for the individual to live in their family home. Respite care through these contracts can be provided in the consumer's home, the home of a friend or relative, or in the community. Family Training and Non-Family Training provide family focused services to family or support staff for the purpose of assisting the family in relating to, caring for, and/or living with an individual receiving services. Families and consumers

may choose their provider from those agencies meeting the qualifications of CMHA-CEI's provider panel.

#### **SUMMARY OF ISSUE:**

The Convulsive Therapy Policy 3.5.03 contained specific detail regarding the requirements for approval of such treatment that is not required by MSHN, the Michigan Mental Health Code, MDHHS, or other state agencies. This detail imposed unnecessary restrictions on use of electroconvulsive therapy. The Authorization of Electroconvulsive Therapy (ECT) Procedure has already been revised to remove these restrictions, and this policy revision will bring the policy and the procedure into alignment. The revised Convulsive Therapy Policy meets the standards of both MSHN and the Michigan Mental Health Code.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff recommends that the Program and Planning Committee of the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties approve the following resolution:

### **Convulsive Therapy Policy, 3.5.03**

# I. Purpose:

To assure that convulsive therapy is administered only when medically indicated and with appropriate consent procedures.

## II. Policy:

A consumer may be treated with electroconvulsive therapy only as part of a current plan of service. Medical necessity for the procedure shall be documented. The Medical Director, or his/her designee may be consulted in regard to the necessity at the discretion of Utilization Management staff.

CMHA-CEI shall notify a minor or an advocate designated by the minor of the right to object to a procedure. Documentation of this notification, including the date and time notified, shall be placed in the clinical record.

CMHA-CEI staff shall assist a minor or an advocate designated by the minor who objects to an electroconvulsive procedure in properly submitting the objection to a court of competent jurisdiction.

Because of its greater safety, and ease of administration and control, electroconvulsive therapy (instead of chemically induced convulsive therapy) will be the standard convulsive treatment technique.
