Convulsive Therapy Policy 3.5.03

Dr. Jennifer Stanley said there was a change in what MSHN was requiring for ECT authorization. This revision will bring the policy into alignment with MSHN and the Michigan Mental Health Code.

Joe said he has shared in the past his reluctance for this treatment. He wondered if there is an age limit for minors to receive ECT? Dr. Stanley said the only case in which she permitted ECT for a pre-pubertal minor was in a severe case of catatonia. She went on to say for anyone under 18, the Michigan Mental Health Code requires two child and adolescent psychiatrists to sign off on this course of treatment and neither can be the treating psychiatrist. So for minors, there are a lot of safeguards around ECT. Dr. Stanley said we authorized ECT for between 32 and 36 individuals in FY 2024. For comparison, we treated over 14,000 individuals in 2024.

a. Crisis Stabilization Unit Update

Sara provided the committee with a flier for the wall-breaking ceremony for the Crisis Care Center! This was the number one name pick from the Consumer Advisory Council. Sara said it was decided that a lot could be done with this name as far as tag lines and branding. The wall breaking will take place on November 25th at 1pm. Sara sent the notice out to the Elected and Appointed Official list. There are going to be ten speakers, including Senators Stebanow and Anthony and Sheriff Wrigglesworth. Sara is hoping the weather holds out for the event!

Sara said this week, at all Ingham County Commission meetings, they are going through the steps to approve the bond notice. The agreement will also be on the agenda for the combined P&P and Finance Committee meeting on December 9th. Sara said she can send out the agreement to the Board now to take a look prior to that meeting.

Sara also said she will need to have a couple of back-up signers for the period of December 26th through January 12th while she is on vacation just in case any documents for the Center need to be signed.

Sara noted two issues with the project at this point. In the site review completed on the McLaren campus site, there was no environmental survey done. Sara went on to note that only one mechanical company bid for the job, and this bid was specifically higher than was originally projected in the budget. There has been a lot of work going on between John Peiffer and his team, Ingham County, and Granger Construction to try and get at least one other bid.

Sue Panetta presented the preliminary end-of-year financials. She said we have not adjusted the MERS liability of \$24M hitting our net position. This will be updated once we receive the reports needed to calculate this number.

Sue then noted that with Medicaid and CCBHC, we are very close to budget. The operating revenue is ahead of budget in total, which includes the bonus of \$4.6M we received for CCBHC.

The biggest difference on the expense side is in the salary and wage line. We are still below for this year – we hover right around 50 open positions.

Sue reviewed the provider network portion of the statements. Our total contract budget of \$83M came in nearly spot on.

In reviewing the bucket report, CCBHC is showing a net gain of \$6.1M. The MSHN lapse dollars are total \$11.7M.

Joe wondered what the mean salary is currently? Sue said a very rough estimate is \$48k. Sara said a lot of open positions are relief staff. Jana noted a recent hiring fair attracted about 100 people. She went on to say that we are at max capacity with interns, and many of these staff become employees. This has been a huge asset in hiring.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHACEI) is seeking approval to purchase and renovate buildings on the former McLaren Greenlawn Campus. CMHA-CEI plans to position a Crisis Stabilization Center as well as move Adult and Children's Crisis Services, Bridges Crisis Unit, and The Recovery Center to this new site and create a new Behavioral Health campus. Bond financing is now underway and we have obtained multiple grants to finance the purchase and renovations to the existing Women's Health Center building in order to create spaces that will meet the operational need. Renovations will include updating colors and finishes to create a warm and welcoming environment and update the building infrastructure. CMHA-CEI staff has worked directly with Ingham County and the Ingham County Building Authority and Bond Council, to develop the needed documents to complete the transaction. The bond sale is expected to occur in December with all transactions closing by December 30, 2024.

Purchase Details: CMHA-CEI will, through bond funding from Ingham County and the Ingham County Building Authority as well as additional grant funding, purchase the existing Women's Health Center Building, Surface Parking and the Radiology and Oncology building as part of the purchase agreement.

Project Details: CMHA-CEI will renovate 80,520 square feet of the Women's Health Center Building that will include demolition of removing walls, some flooring and ceilings. New construction will consist of building out new walls, with the installation of some new flooring, and ceilings, including anti ligature construction for consumer/patient rooms to meet operational needs. Colors and finishes will be updated to create

and building infrastructure will be updated.

Project Funding and Sources:

Project Total Cost \$35,400,000.00. Financing: Grants \$11,400,000.00 Financing: Bond \$24,000,000.00 Bond Not to exceed \$26,000,000.00

Proposed Lease: CMHA-CEI will make lease payments to Ingham County as a means to pay back the Bond of \$24,000,000.00 over a period of 25 years at which time CMHA-CEI will take ownership of the buildings. The overall agreement with Ingham County includes a lease and sublease structured between CMHA-CEI, Ingham County and the Ingham County Building Authority.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this revenue contract renewal, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) will provide Outpatient Substance Abuse Treatment as a follow up for men who have completed residential treatment at the House of Commons and both men and women who complete other residential programs that hold an Office of Community Corrections contract. In addition, CMHA-CEI will also provide outpatient services to women who have completed a residential treatment facility through the 30th Circuit Court.

Services are for clients who are referred to residential treatment by 30th Circuit Court Probation and, upon completion of their residential stay, are court ordered to attend the aftercare component, Relapse Prevention and Recovery (RP&R). RP&R supports approximately 100 unique individuals in a fiscal year. CMHA-CEI Substance Abuse Services employees dedicated to this program will provide assessment (if needed), treatment planning, and group counseling. Individual counseling is available upon request. Group counseling occurs twice weekly for 8 weeks; and then if completed the client attends group one time a week for another 4 weeks. The contract amount for the retroactive period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025 is \$71,918.

The revenue and expense of this contract are reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY 25 budget. The revenue source that supports this contract is Ingham County, Office of Community Corrections. The expenses of this contract are reflected in the HOC Aftercare Cost

Center budget. This contract does cover the administrative costs incurred. This contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

DESCRIPTION OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN CONTRACT/ PROPOSAL:

This is a long- standing contract through the Ingham County Office of Community Corrections. The program provides supportive treatment to men after completion of the House of Commons residential program and for women who have completed residential services through 30th Circuit Court Probation. Clients referred to this program are court ordered through 30th Circuit Court and received continued outpatient treatment for three months post residential treatment completion in order to continue working on relapse prevention, recovery and maintaining a successful re-entry into the community.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommend that the Finance Committee of Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties approve the following resolution:

The Finance Committee recommends that the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties Board of Directors authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into a contract renewal with the Ingham County Office of Community Corrections to provide outpatient treatment in the Relapse Prevention and Recovery Program (RP&R) for men and women who have been court ordered upon completion of residential treatment services for the retroactive period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025 and receive \$71,918 for those services.

Each waiver eligible child can attend up to \$4,200 (max of three sessions per year up to \$1,400 each session) of camp sessions per fiscal year which is reimbursable through the SEDW program.

The expense of this contract is reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY 2025 budget. The revenue sources that support this contract are Medicaid SEDW. The expenses of this contract are reflected in the Contract-Medicaid SED line item of the Families Forward Respite budget. This contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

Children receiving the SEDW are able to access three sessions of summer camp to promote pro-social skills, enjoy a peer centered experience and provide caregivers respite. The Eagle Village Inc. has successfully served our SEDW children and teens, many of whom are unable to be maintained in a traditional camp setting. Their programs focus on helping campers develop the skills that are necessary for them to have great success in life and help children gain confidence.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this renewal contract, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties will purchase services from Cognitive & Behavioral Consultants, training consultant, to provide training and coaching in Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) for Adolescents for the retroactive period of October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025, and CMHA-CEI will pay no more than \$153,100 for these services. This is an increase from \$61,750 due to the addition of a training cohort for which Cognitive & Behavioral Consultants will be the training consultant.

Expenses from this contract are reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY25 budget. The revenue sources that support this contract are federal block grant dollars. The expenses of this contract are reflected in the Contract-Training line item of the CBT Trauma Informed Grant budget. Indirect costs are reimbursed at 10.00%, for the first \$50,000 of each contract, for fiscal year 2025. Any indirect costs, including administration, that are not reimbursable by the grant must be covered with State General Funds or Local funding sources. This contract may decrease CMHA-CEI's fund balance by an undetermined dollar amount if there are not enough State General Funds or Local funding sources to cover the remaining indirect costs.

DESCRIPTION OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Cognitive & Behavioral Consultants will provide:

During the contract year 2025, 2 cohorts will be involved in various stages of the DBT for Adolescents Learning Collaborative (LC). The purpose of the DBT for Adolescents LC is to support participating clinicians and supervisors in the training, implementation, fidelity, and sustainability of DBT for Adolescents. Research studies have demonstrated that DBT for Adolescents is effective in reducing incidents of suicidal attempts in adolescents as well as nonsuicidal self-injurious behaviors (NSSI). The above will be accomplished through virtual

trainings, consultation calls, regularly scheduled webinars, and the Joint PMTO & Children's Trauma Initiative State Conference.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

Because this provides CMHA-CEI's Families Forward with a unique opportunity to partner with Cognitive & Behavioral Consultants in advancing clinical interventions for youth and families, staff recommends that the Finance Committee of the CMH Board of Directors approve the following resolution:

The Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMH to enter into a renewal contract with Cognitive & Behavioral Consultants to provide DBT for Adolescents expert training and consultation to CMHSP's and pay no more than \$153,100 for those services for the retroactive period October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

Michael Gomez will provide: Two (2) cohorts will be involved in various stages of the TF-CBT Learning Collaborative (LC). The purpose of the TF-CBT LC is to support participating clinicians and supervisors in the training, implementation, fidelity, and

sustainability of TF-CBT. Research studies have demonstrated that TF-CBT is effective in reducing the symptomology associated with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder in children. The above will be accomplished through virtual trainings, consultation calls, regularly scheduled webinars, and the Joint PMTO & Children's Trauma Initiative State Conference. In addition to the above, a Components for Enhancing Career Experience and Reducing Trauma (CE-CERT) learning collaborative will also be facilitated including training and consultation to address secondary trauma symptoms.

Criteria for Enhanced Staff Inpatient Psychiatric Services are as follows:

- 1. The Consumer must meet all of the Inpatient Admission Certification Criteria listed above (Diagnosis, Severity of Illness, and Intensity of Service).

The respective Neuropsychiatric Hospitals, LLC hospital facility will work the responsible CMHC on discharge planning to ensure a safe and timely discharge of the patient.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this amendment, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) will purchase Partial Hospitalization services from Cedar Creek Hospital at the additional location identified below in accordance with the schedule of service below. This contract is an amendment of an existing agreement for Partial Hospitalization services to add an additional Partial Hospital location. The contract makes no guarantee of a minimum number of patient referrals for hospital services. This amendment to add the additional location is for the term of December 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025.

The revenue and expense of this contract are reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY 2025 budget. The revenue sources that support this contract are Medicaid plans, State General Funds, federal or state contracts, or local funding sources. The expenses of this contract are reflected in the various Contract line items of the AMHS budget. This contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

SUMMARY OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN THE CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Partial Hospitalization services include hospitalization; professional fees; comprehensive psychiatric assessment and diagnosis; neurological and/or psychological testing; individual, group and family psychotherapy; specialized education; activity therapy; dietary and specialized nutritional services; medications; speech and hearing evaluation and treatment; laboratory services; discharge planning; and coordination of care with CMHA-CEI.

SUMMARY OF CONTRACT/PROPOSAL:

Under this revenue contract renewal, Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) will receive funding from Kent County CMHA dba Network180, through the Mental Health Block Grant 10% Set Aside-First Episode Psychosis grant to provide services to individuals enrolled in the NAVIGATE Program. The grant will provide \$610,108 in total funding for the retroactive period of October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025. With that funding, CMHA-CEI will continue to employ/contract with a Mental Health team consisting of the following:

1.0 FTE Mental Health Therapist

0.75 FTE Mental Health Therapist

0.5 FTE Mental Health Therapist

1.0 FTE Client Services Specialist

0.085 Registered Nurse

0.5 FTE Peer Support Specialist

0.15 Staff Psychiatrist

The revenue and expense of this contract are reflected in CMHA-CEI's FY2025 budget. This program will be funded primarily by NAVIGATE grant funds. The revenue sources that support this contract are the NAVIGATE grant, Medicaid, state general fund, and

block grant funds. Revenue may also be provided by commercial insurance, Medicare, or local sources. The expenses of this contract are reflected in the NAVIGATE grant budget. This contract does cover the administrative costs incurred with the operation of this program. This contract will not affect CMHA-CEI's fund balance.

DESCRIPTION OF GOODS OR SERVICES REFERENCED IN CONTRACT/ PROPOSAL:

Approximately 100,000 adolescents and young adults in the United States experience First Episode Psychosis (FEP) each year with a peak onset occurring between 15-25 years of age, psychotic disorders such as schizophrenia can derail a young person's social, academic, and vocational development and initiate a trajectory of accumulating disability. Youth who are experiencing FEP are often frightened and confused, and struggle to understand what is happening to them. They also present unique challenges to family members and clinical providers, including irrational behavior, aggression against self or others, difficulties communicating and relating, and conflicts with authority figures. Impaired awareness of illness may be an additional complicating factor. Despite these complexities, early intervention with evidence-based therapies offers real hope for clinical and functional recovery.

An abundance of data accumulated over the past two decades supports the value of early intervention following the first episode of psychosis. Coordinated Specialty Care (CSC) is a team-based, multi-element approach to treating FEP. CSC is intended primarily for youth, adolescents, and young adults ages 15-25. Early intervention programs are designed to bridge existing services for these groups and eliminate gaps between child, adolescent, and adult mental health programs. At its core, CSC is a collaborative, recovery-oriented approach involving clients, treatment team members, and, when appropriate, relatives as active participants. CSC emphasizes shared decision making as a means for addressing the unique needs, preferences, and recovery goals of individuals with FEP. Collaborative treatment planning in CSC is a respectful and effective means for establishing a positive therapeutic alliance and maintaining engagement with clients and their family members over time. CSC services are also highly coordinated with primary medical care, with a focus on optimizing a client's overall mental and physical health.

All Services follow the Early Intervention Treatment Model and may include:

- Access to clinical providers with specialized training in FEP care
- Case management
- Psychotherapy
- Family education and support
- Supportive employment and education
- Pharmacotherapy and coordination with primary healthcare
- Peer Services
- Mobile outreach and crisis intervention

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into a contract renewal with Kent County CMHA dba Network180 to receive Mental Health Block Grant 10% Set Aside-First Episode Psychosis grant funds in the amount of \$610,108 to provide services to individuals enrolled in the NAVIGATE Program for the retroactive period of October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2025.
