Mid-State Health Network (MSHN) Update:

Joe Brehler provided updates about the most recent MSHN Board meeting. The discussion centered around the negative amounts of money the CMHs' have going into this next fiscal year.

NAVIGATE BOARD PRESENTATION

Liz Parker, AMHS Supervisor, and Allysa Pennington, Coordinator, provided updates on Navigate to the board.

• Background

- NAVIGATE is an evidence based treatment model designed to provide early treatment for individuals who have experienced a first episode of unspecified psychosis. The population that is served is between 15 and 30 years old with most of the population we are serving falling between 18 and 25 years of age. This is a program for individuals who have had symptoms for 18 months or less.
- There are definite symptoms before some has their first psychotic episode and clinicians are able to take a look at these symptoms to determine if they would be a good fit for this program. It is not always clear though if the symptoms are going to lead to a psychotic episode but we use our best judgement in these decisions.
- This program is for anyone on the schizophrenia spectrum including schizoaffective, schizophrenia, etc.
- Unspecified psychosis would include delusions, disorganized speech, thoughts, behavior.

- Individual Resiliency Training
 - One of the components to NAVIGATE is individual resiliency training. The goals of IRT are improving functioning, reducing symptoms, teaching coping strategies, and achieving life goals. IRT focuses on building resiliency through education, wellness, and processing.
- Benefits
 - It helps people find and keep jobs, build skills, and advocate for accommodations. Assists with schooling accommodations and strategies for success.
 - Focuses on education of how to support a loved one through their psychosis experience including medication, effective communication, and healthy lifestyles.
- Support
 - Includes medication management and peer support. Peer support is for individuals and families.
- Funding
 - There are 5 NAVIGATE teams across the state of Michigan funded by a grant held through Network 180.
 - NAVIGATE bills both private insurance and Medicaid for eligible services.
 - When they have Medicaid, we can bill for peer support but the family care partner is not a recognized peer support. When it is private insurance we will not get CCBHC funding. We do get the enhanced rate for Medicaid which is supposed to help to cover the gap in the Non-Medicaid.

- Initiatives
 - Increasing community knowledge
 - Supported education and employment specialist and family peer partner experience challenges with billing due to insurance codes working on group rate billing codes
 - There is current research being done on this model
- Outreach
 - Have reached out to all of the larger private practices in the area to inform them of this program.
- Barriers
 - Commercial insurance will not pay for any supportive education for this program.

CEO REPORT

Business Update

- MDHHS Rate Setting Meeting
 - This meeting was with all of the PIHPs. They did mention that the state is going to move forward with rate adjustments based on rate of rejection in Medicaid enrollments. They will be applying the rates starting in September but will be doubling the rate to make up for the first 6 months of the fiscal year. The state average is 3%. That means 6% will be applied. Our regional rate is not known yet because there are many geographic (and other) factors. Not every area has the same rate.
 - \circ They have noticed that there seems to be large decrease of Medicaid

enrollments for the DAB (Disabled, Aged, and Blind) population of Medicaid. This population comes with the highest capitation rate. There is a lot of analysis going on for this because usually people who are disabled, aged, or blind do not fall off and are enrolled in this for life.

Community Project

We had applied for an additional community project through Senator Peters office in case our we did not receive an extension on our SAMHSA grant for the Crisis Stabilization Unit. Since we applied, there is an additional 1.9 million dollars embedded in the federal budget. If the federal budget gets approved, we will be receiving this funding. People being enrolled in the wrong plans

MDHHS Statewide Meeting

MDHHS has scheduled a statewide meeting for April 1st to share their plan for conflict free. This may result in some statewide advocacy depending on what they mention in their plan. Sara will keep everyone informed on what is happening with this.
