Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Sara Clark Pierson at 5:36 p.m.

Previous Meeting Minutes:

MOVED by Raul Gonzales and SUPPORTED by Kay Randolph-Back to approve the meeting minutes of March 11, 2015.

Adoption of Agenda:

BUSINESS ITEMS:

MERS Presentation: GASB 68 Overview (CMHA-CEI)

Stacia Chick presented GASB 68 (GASB stands for Governmental Accounting Standards Board), a new requirement that changes the way government entities that offer defined benefit plans report pension liabilities. Donna Brower, with CMHA-CEI's Payroll/Benefits Department, introduced Marne Carlson, MERS Regional Manager, to provide a detailed overview of GASB 68 information. Marne Carlson provided a 2013 annual evaluation which affects the 2015 budget. The amortization policy was reviewed along with CMHA-CEI's funding history and actuarial evaluation. Discussion ensued regarding defined benefit plans versus defined contribution plans. Marne Carlson also mentioned that MERS is implementing a system at the end of 2015 that will allow employees to view a snapshot of their retirement progress.

The summary of changes was further reviewed. Though a government entity's pension numbers may seem different under the new reporting requirement, the financial situation of the retirement plan has not changed. The most notable change is the separation of accounting calculations from funding calculations. Discussion ensued regarding future financial reports and providing early estimated GASB 68 numbers to prepare for the change.

MOVED by Joe Brehler and SUPPORTED by Chris Swope that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) authorize CMHA-CEI to renew the following lease contracts based on the fact that the information has been reviewed and the contracts are in line with agency responsibilities:

Lease contract renewal of the property at 1520 West Wieland, DeWitt Township, MI from Sko (Roseanne) Schafer, residing at 905 Glenwood Terrace Anniston, Alabama 36207, for the period of May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2018 and pay as follows:

- CMH-CEI shall pay to the Lessor for the premises during the period of May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2016, the sum of Twenty Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Two dollars (\$20,952.00) --per annum and payable in installments of One Thousand Seven Hundred Forty Six dollars (\$1,746.00) --per month.
- CMH-CEI shall pay to the Lessor for the premises during the period of May 1, 2016 through April 30, 2017, the sum of Twenty One Thousand Three Hundred Seventy Two dollars (\$21,372.00) --per annum and payable in installments of One Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty One dollars (\$1,781.00) --per month.
- CMH-CEI shall pay to the Lessor for the premises during the period of May 1, 2017 through April 30, 2018, the sum of Twenty One Thousand Eight Hundred Four dollars (\$21,804.00) --per annum and payable in installments of One Thousand Eight Hundred Seventeen dollars and 50/100 (\$1,817.00) --per month. Installment payments shall be made during the month for which the installment is applicable. Each monthly installment payment includes insurance escrow, real estate tax escrow, and base rent.

Lease contract renewal, as Landlord, of the property at 1507 Jerome Street, Lansing, MI to tenant Theresa Biron, whose address is 1507 Jerome Street, Lansing, MI, for the period of May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2020 and receive the following as revenue:

Twelve Thousand Two Hundred Forty Dollars (\$12,240) per year in equal monthly installments of One Thousand Twenty and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,020) during the term of this lease for a total of Sixty One Thousand Two Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$61,200) during the 60 month period.

<u>Expense Proposal: Sanitary Sewer Project – 5343 Willoughby Road, Lansing (CMHA-CEI)</u>

John Peiffer presented a proposal to complete the project of replacing the existing failing septic system located at 5343 Willoughby Road in Lansing. Some factors that caused the problem were soil issues, high water table, and high usage of the home. Many options were explored on how to solve the problem. After a new septic system was discouraged by the Health Department, the solution to tie into the City of

Lansing sewer was decided upon. After six months of collaborating with the appropriate municipalities, the project was approved.

MOVED by Chris Swope and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) authorize CMHA-CEI staff to complete the following:

Proposal:

CMHA-CEI Property and Facilities staff complete the project of replacing the existing failing septic system located at 5343 Willoughby Road, Lansing, MI by awarding a formal construction contract to a contractor yet to be named through a formal bid process.

Project Expenses:

Contractor construction costs, City of Lansing plans and permit fees and connection fees plus 10% for contingency are expected not to exceed \$50,551.85.

Funding:

Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton and Ingham Counties will utilize the Fixed Asset Reserve Budget for funding this project and in doing so capitalize the expense over 25 years at a rate of \$2,022.07 per year.

Expense contract renewal with Christine O'Connor, located at 1832 Snyder Road, East Lansing MI, to purchase foster care services for the period January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017 and pay \$75.00 per day for any placed youth. Having just received this contract from Christine O'Connor, note that it is retroactive from January 1, 2015.

Expense contract renewals with the below listed camps to purchase Respite Services for the period of June 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015 and pay according to the accompanying rate schedule for those services.

Revenue contract renewal with Gratiot County Community Mental Health to provide and maintain the Echo data system, the CEI Clinical System, and the Filebound Document Imaging System for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015 and receive \$119,300.76 for that service. Having just received this contract, note that it is retroactive from October 1, 2014.

Expense contract renewal with The Echo Group for maintenance of Clinician's Desktop and Revenue Manager for the period of May 14, 2015 through May 13, 2016 and pay \$77,450.00 for that maintenance.

Revenue contract renewal with Gratiot County Community Mental Health to provide technical support for billing software and provide guidance for billing and reimbursement functions for the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015 and receive \$24,228, plus mileage and meal reimbursement, for that service. Having just received this contract, note that it is retroactive from October 1, 2014.

Expense Proposal: SAN Upgrade (CMHA-CEI)

Chuck Dougherty presented a proposal to upgrade CMHA-CEI's Storage Area Network (SAN) system with purchases from Dell/MIDeal, Mirazon, CDW Government, and several other low-bidding suppliers. In 2011, the current SAN system was purchased and CMHA-CEI is now running out of available space at the projected time. The use of storage is going up approximately 30% per year and needs regular expansion.

ACTION:

MOVED by Chris Swope and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) authorize CMHA-CEI to purchase SAN hardware and software from MIDeal, Mirazon, CDW Government, and other suppliers and pay a total amount of approximately \$360,000, to be amortized over five years, for this system.

FY 2015 JP Morgan Chase Bank Vehicle Loan Resolution (CMHA-CEI)

Stacia Chick presented the JP Morgan Chase Bank resolution regarding borrowing, reimbursement, and tax qualification which will enable CMHA-CEI to finance 13 new vehicles. The purchase was originally approved in September 2014 for \$395,700. The cost of the vehicles has been reduced and revised to \$360,658.

ACTION:

MOVED by Chris Swope and SUPPORTED by Joe Brehler that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties (CMHA-CEI) adopt the certified resolutions regarding JP Morgan Chase Bank borrowing, reimbursement, and tax qualifications for the purchase of 13 vehicles from Gorno Ford and Varsity Ford in the amount of \$360,658.

Old Business:

FY 2015 MSHN Additional Benefit Stabilization and Ingham County Health Services Millage Funds Program Proposals

Stacia Chick presented the program proposals for the previously approved additional funding from the MSHN Additional Benefit Stabilization and Ingham County Health Services Millage Funds. The detailed proposal for how the funds will be

used was provided and reviewed. Some notable changes were the addition of 16 new positions and the restoration of 1.5 positions to serve hundreds of new individuals. After the General Fund reduction earlier this year, the budget froze many of these new positions. The new source of funding is not only being allocated to close the budget gap because there is a need to expand to fulfill new outreach and services. CMHA-CEI staff thanked the Finance Committee for the previous approval of these proposals because it has enabled staff to expedite filling the necessary positions. Discussion ensued regarding fee for service.
