<u>Revenue Contract Amendment: Ingham County, Office of Community Corrections</u> Ericanne presented a contract amendment with Ingham County for outpatient services for women at the House of Commons. Discussion ensued about services provided around the state by other community corrections departments.

ACTION:

MOVED by Chris Swope and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Finance Committee recommends that the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, Ingham Counties Board of Directors authorize CMHA-CEI to approve a contract amendment with the Ingham County Office of Community Corrections to provide women specific treatment in addiction services for the period of April 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017 and receive for those services \$10,349.00.

New Revenue Contract: Amended Funding - City of Lansing

Shana Badgley presented a contract amendment with the City of Lansing for more funds for Bridges Crisis Unit to offset general fund money. The original amount was \$20,000 but the city has increased the amount to \$35,000

ACTION:

MOVED Carol Koenig and SUPPORTED by Kam Washburn that the Finance Committee recommends that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into a contract with City of Lansing for the period of 10/1/2016 to 7/1/2017 and receive \$35,000 to help cover General Fund costs of Bridges Crisis Unit.

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Acceptance of Steady State Budget Assumptions for Fiscal Year 2017/2018 (CMHA-<u>CEI)</u>

Stacia Chick presented and reviewed the Steady State Budget Assumptions expenses and revenues for FY17/18. New actuarial assumptions were reviewed for MERS. Discussion ensued about the amounts paid in past years versus how much CMHA-CEI would be paying for FY17/18, and the advantages and disadvantages of the phase-in versus the full impact contributions to pension plans. Stacia asked for guidance from the committee about which funding level to choose.

MOVED by Kam Washburn and SUPPORTED by Carol Koenig that the Finance Committee provide guidance to CHMA-CEI management that the full impact of the MERS assumptions and method changes be included in the Fiscal Year 2017/2018 Steady State Budget Assumptions.

MOTION CARRIED unanimously.

Stacia also asked for further guidance from the committee regarding the continuation of the 7-Year Fund Balance Restoration Plan, as presented to the committee in August

2015. The committee guided management to include the restoration plan in the Fiscal Year 2017/2018 Steady State Assumptions.

ACTION:

MOVED by Chris Swope and SUPPORTED by Kam Washburn that the Finance Committee accepts the Fiscal Year 2017/2018 Steady State Budget Assumptions as guided by committee.
