

A refugee is someone outside of his or her home country who has a "well founded fear of persecution" because of his/her: race, religion, nationality, social group or political opinion.

- 68.5 million displaced
- 22.5 million refugees
- 52% children
- < 1% ever resettled
- 10+ years as refugee
- 70,000 avg. resettled in US
- 2017 only 50,000 resettled
- 2018 less than 45,000 will be resettled...22,000



The journey of a refugee to the United States





A refugee is a person who must leave his or her homeland due to persecution of beliefs, race or ethnicity. In 2017, 68.5 million people were forcibly displaced.



Refugees usually wait upwards of 10 years as a refugee. And less than 1% are ever selected to be resettled.



There is a lot of work to do. Please remain hopeful.


